

EDUCATIONAL PACT OF CO-RESPONSIBILITY SCHOOL-FAMILY

(Presidential Decree 249/1998, Article 3 of Presidential Decree 21 November 2007, No. 235, Institute Regulations and Statute of Students and Students).

The Educational Pact of co-responsibility aims at engaging families and pupils to share with the school the founding core of educational action. This "agreement" between teachers, parents and students arises from the need to have common objectives and it indicates the commitments that everyone is required to take despite the different roles that each individual play in the school. It differs from the Regulation of the Institute which instead has the purpose of defining the behaviors allowed and those prohibited in the school organization.

THE SCHOOL IS COMMITTED TO:

- providing a qualified cultural and professional education, open to the plurality of ideas, in regards to the identity of each student;
- offering an environment which is conducive to the integral growth of the person, guaranteeing a quality teaching service in a serene educational environment and facilitating the training process of each student, regarding his / her rhythms and learning speed;
- offering substantive initiatives for the recovery from disadvantage situations in order to promote educational success and defeat school dropout as well as promoting merit and encouraging excellence;
- promoting full integration of students with disabilities, encouraging initiatives to welcome foreign students, protecting their language and culture also through the implementation of intercultural initiatives, stimulating reflections and activate paths aimed at the welfare and protection of students' health ;

- guaranteeing the utmost transparency in evaluations and communications, maintaining a constant relationship with families, also through technologically advanced tools, while respecting privacy;

- creating an educational climate of serenity and cooperation which fosters the responsible growth of the students who educate themselves to respect individual differences and inclinations, preventing situations of unease, prejudice and marginalization;

- offering to the students, through its agents, models of good behavior, respectful of the rules, tolerant, available to dialogue and confrontation.

THE FAMILY IS COMMITTED TO:

- enhancing the educational institution, establishing a positive climate of dialogue, respecting educational choices as well as an attitude of mutual collaboration with teachers;

- respecting the school institution with particular regards to punctuality and attendance of their children to lessons and checking daily all communications sent by the school;

- observing and ensuring that their children respect the Institute Regulations;

- helping their children to relate positively with their mates, encouraging them to maintain a correct and polite behavior and to respect all the people that work in the school;

- ensuring that their children bring the necessary school materials and do take care of the structures, furnishings and objects of the school;

- passing on to their children the message that school is of fundamental importance for their responsible growth.

- Discussing, presenting and sharing with their children the agreement signed with the school.

THE STUDENT IS COMMITTED TO:

- being aware of their rights and duties by respecting the school, the environment and equipment;


- respecting the scheduled and agreed time with the teachers to achieve their curriculum, engaging in a responsible manner in the execution of the required tasks;
