

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STUDENTS STATUTE

This statute is issued pursuant to Decree n.249 of 24.06.1998 and Decree n.235 of 21.11.2007, and it is aimed at students of Secondary School of I and II degree.

Art. 1- Life of the school community

The school is an educational and training environment achieved through the study, acquisition of knowledge and the development of critical consciousness. It is a community of dialogue inspired by democratic values. It establishes its educational activity on the relationship between teacher and pupils with the aim of developing the personality and orientation of young people. Life at school is based on freedom of expression, thoughts, conscience, religion and on mutual respect among all the people that are part of it, regardless of their age and condition, while repudiating any form of ideological, social and cultural barrier.

Art.2 – Student’s rights

1. The student has the right to a qualified cultural and professional education that respects and enhances, also through orientation, the identity of each person and is open to the plurality of ideas. The school enhances students' personal inclinations also through adequate information, the possibility to formulate requests, to develop freely chosen topics and to carry out autonomous initiatives.
2. The school community promotes solidarity among its members and protects the student's right to privacy.
3. The student has the right to be informed about the decisions and rules that regulate the life of the school.
4. The student has the right to active and responsible participation in the life of the school.
5. The student has the right to a transparent and prompt evaluation aimed at activating a self-evaluation process that leads him to identify his own strengths and weaknesses and to improve his performance.
6. The student has the right to freedom of learning and autonomously exercises the right to choose between the additional curricular activities and the optional additional activities offered by the school.
7. The foreign student has the right of have his cultural and religious life respected.

8. The school guarantees and regulates in its regulation students' right to hold students' meetings both at class and course level.

Art.3 -Duties of the student

1. The student is required to regularly attend all courses and fulfill study commitments.
2. The student is required to comply with the rules referring to him contained in the Regulations of the Institute.
3. The student is required to have towards the Principal, the Teachers, all the staff of the School and other students the same respect that he would require for himself.
4. The student is required to observe the rules, organizational and safety provisions referring to him as dictated by the Institute's regulations.
5. The student is obliged to correctly use the facilities, equipment and teaching aids without damaging the academic heritage, personal integrity or assets of the other students, staff or third parties present in the school building.
6. The student shares with the school staff the responsibility of keeping the school environment decent and welcoming, committing to take care of it.
7. The student is required to respect the privacy of other students and all the staff.
8. The student is required to promptly and correctly communicate all information provided by the School for the family and vice versa.

Art.4-Disciplinary regulation

For the disciplinary regulations, reference is made to the Institute Regulations which identify the behaviors that constitute disciplinary deficiencies, the relative sanctions and the competent bodies to manage them according to the criteria set out below:

1. The disciplinary measures have educational purposes and tend to reinforce the sense of responsibility, to recover the student through activities of a cultural and social nature and for the benefit of the school community in general;
2. Disciplinary responsibility is personal; nobody can be subjected to disciplinary sanctions without having been first invited to give reasons for their actions;
3. No disciplinary offense related to behavior can affect the valuation of profit;
4. The sanctions take into account the student's personal situation, the severity of the behavior and the consequences that derive from it.
